

WINTER Sunrise and Sunset Alpine Photography Tours

Spectacular sunrises and sunsets over the alpine horizon light up the mountain skies, rewarding photographers of all levels and abilities with unforgettable memories and images. Capture the sights and scenes of fresh alpine air on your camera as we snowshoe through gently undulating snow covered slopes amongst ancient twisted snow gums.

What's included:

Mike will safely take you into Kosciusko National Park for a truly fun experience snow camping amongst the snow gums. Snowshoes are included.

Where to meet:

Meet at the Perisher ski tube building outside [Aldo's Cafe](#) (upper level, Perisher Ski Tube Terminal) at 6.20am for Sunrise Tours and at 3pm for Sunset Tours. Travelling on the [Ski Tube](#) (<http://www.perisher.com.au/resort-information/getting-to-perisher/skitube.html>), we will travel to Blue Cow (elevation 1905m) to find the best spots to photograph the alpine landscape and the rising or setting sun.

How to get to Perisher:

You can catch the [Ski Tube](#) to Perisher from Bullocks Flat (take the turn-off to Thredbo) or drive to Perisher and park in the Perisher car park. Perisher is approximately ½ an hour's drive from Jindabyne.

What to bring:

- Day pack
- Camera – fully charged, tripod with 1-2 batteries, memory card/s
- 1 litre of water
- High energy snacks (such as some chocolate or mixed nuts)

What to wear:

Wearing layers is a good idea, especially light weight/quick dry gear that packs small and can be put on/off easily if the weather changes during the day (no cotton clothes).

- Thermals under warm long pants and thermals under a long sleeved top
- Down, Primaloft or fleece jacket for extra warmth
- Gore-Tex (or similar) waterproof parka
- Warm thermal socks
- Gore-Tex (or similar) waterproof hiking boots
- Beanie
- Warm snow gloves and liners

Level of fitness required

A low level of fitness is required to enjoy this photographic workshop and tour through the snow. You should feel comfortable to be walking slowly for about three hours. There will be plenty of time to stop, rest and photograph the alpine landscape.

Group size

The maximum group size is 6 (unless discussed otherwise)
